April is Parkinson's Awareness Month. Nearly one million people in the US are living with Parkinson's disease and April is when friends, family and volunteers come together to raise awareness about the disease and help raise funds to fight it.

This year, the Parkinson's Disease Foundation (PDF) is launching a new program for schools called *Tulips Bloom In April* — as tulips are the symbol of Parkinson's awareness. Through this program we hope to encourage students to get involved in charitable causes and show them that they can make a difference in the fight against Parkinson's!

Parkinson's disease is a movement disorder that involves the malfunction of vital cells in the brain. These cells are responsible for producing a chemical called dopamine, which controls the way we move. As the disease progresses, the amount of dopamine decreases, leaving a person unable to control movement normally. The cause is unknown and although there is presently no cure, there are treatments such as medicine and a surgery that can manage the symptoms.

One of PDF's primary objectives is to prepare *future leaders* in Parkinson's research and clinical practice by awarding fellowships and career development grants to young researchers and graduate students – we believe that it is never too early to spark inspiration in students. One of your students may one day grow up to conduct the research that leads to the cure for Parkinson's!

There are many ways for your school or class to join in PDF's *Tulips Bloom in April* program. Our goal is to have **30 schools/classes** participate in either an awareness day or small fundraising activity during the month of April. Along with this letter you will find a list of activity ideas that are fun, educational and easy to execute.

PDF is growing awareness in April and we hope that you will join us. We will highlight your school's efforts via our website, newsletter and social media and show the Parkinson's community that even the youngest among us are showing their support and doing their part in the fight against Parkinson's.
